Fall Events

These events are aimed at facilitating collaboration between watershed producers to the benefit of your bottom line and our water. Producer Operation Tour

The best way to understand if a practice is right for you is to see it in action. That's the idea behind our producer operation tour; we'll visit three sites on Tuesday 10/21/14 so you can see what practices are working for a few of your neighbors. The schedule is as follows:

- **Lick Farm: Innovative Crop Practices, Crops & Livestock**
- **Goven Ranch: Grazing Management & Soil Health For Profit**
- **Anderson Ranch: Grazing & Biodiversity, Cattle Watering**

The tour begins at the Lick farmstead (see map) at 8:30 on Tuesday, 10/21/14. We expect to finish up in the early afternoon, around 1:00.

Tour Meet Up


Date: Tuesday, 10/21/14

Meeting Place: Lick Farm on Hwy 6

Directions: You can get to Myron's by taking Hwy 41 to County Hwy 6 and heading west. The Lick farmstead will be on your right about 2 miles after you cross Turtle Creek.

Duration: Plan on finishing the tour early afternoon, approximately 1:00. All participants are invited to join us for snacks, coffee, and informal discussion at the South McLean SCD office in Turtle Lake immediately following the tour.



Producer Led Workshops

The South McLean SCD will be hosting two consecutive workshops during the first week of November. Each workshop will be led by 2-3 of your neighbors. Workshops will begin with a brief introduction by each lead followed by informal discussions and planning regarding what might work for *your* operation. You'll leave with a working plan that you can put into practice whenever you're ready!
